Dorothée Baumann-Pauly is a business ethics scholar with extensive practical experience working on the implementation of human rights in multi-stakeholder settings. Since 2013, she is the Director of Research at the NYU Stern Center for Business and Human Rights, managing its strategic, industry-specific research agenda. Since 2019, she directs the Geneva Center for Business and Human Rights at Geneva University's School for Economics and Management.

She has published widely on topics at the intersection of business ethics, corporate responsibility, private governance mechanisms and human rights and serves on the editorial board of the *Business and Human Rights Journal*. She is the author of *Managing Corporate Legitimacy* (Greenleaf 2013) and the coeditor of *Business and Human Rights – From Principles to Practice* (Routledge 2016), the first textbook on business and human rights.

Dorothée received a PhD in economics from the University of Zurich (Switzerland), an MA in Political Science from Rutgers University (USA) and an MA in Public Policy and Management from the University of Constance (Germany). She teaches business and human rights related subjects at HEC Lausanne, NYU Stern and other academic institutions in the US and Europe.

Florian Wettstein holds a PhD in business ethics from the University of St.Gallen. He is a past fellow of the Program on Human Rights and Justice at MIT and held previous faculty positions at York University (Toronto) and University of St. Thomas (Minneapolis/St. Paul).

Florian's research focuses predominantly on the intersection between business ethics and human rights. His article titled "CSR and the Debate on Business and Human Rights: Bridging the Great Divide" won the Business Ethics Quarterly best paper award in 2012. Florian is the author of "Multinational Corporations and Global Justice: Human Rights Obligations of a Quasi-Governmental Institution", published by Stanford University Press in 2009.

Florian is Vice-President of the International Society of Business, Economics, and Ethics (ISBEE) and of the Global Business and Human Rights Scholars Association (BR2R) as well as Editor-in-Chief of the *Business and Human Rights Journal (BHRJ)*, published by Cambridge University Press.

Uma Mishra-Newbery

Uma Mishra-Newbery is a global social justice and women's rights leader, transformative speaker and the former Executive Director of Women's March Global. Her transparent, visionary yet grounded leadership was instrumental in furthering the mobilization and assembly of women globally around women's rights issues with Women's March Global.

Uma has organized and built coalitions around the issues of women's human rights defenders, freedom of association and assembly, bodily autonomy, LGBTQIA+ rights, and white supremacy in the women's rights and funding space. As a leader in the global women's rights movement Uma has been interviewed by CNN, AlJazeera, Jane Dutton, Newsweek, Devex and published by Ms. Magazine, TIME, and IPS.

Uma helped to bring Saudi women's rights activist Loujain AlHathloul's story to the United Nations and was instrumental in coordinating efforts for Lina AlHathloul's first statement in support of Loujain at the United Nations Human Rights Council. Uma and Lina are co-authors of the upcoming children's picture book, "Loujain Dreams of Sunflowers."

Uma has been profiled by the Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights in there, "I Stand with Her Campaign" and is a noted speaker at global conferences. She currently serves on the board of directors of Minority Veterans of America and Women's March Global, is a campaign organizer for #FreeLoujain and is the Initiator of and lead facilitator for The Racial Equity Index.



Christoph Good

Christoph Good is an experienced trial lawyer and criminal defense attorney. He focuses primarily on the following areas: Probate law, Criminal Law, Employment law, Fundamental and human rights.

He represents private individuals as well as companies and authorities before the courts and works mainly before the courts of the cantons of Zurich, Schwyz and St. Gallen. In addition, Christoph Good has co-authored various legal opinions for federal offices (SECO/EDA/OFJ) in the field of "Business & Human Rights" and advises companies on the development and implementation of human rights. due diligence systems.

Christoph Good has been an attorney since 2014 and is one of the founding partners of Good Rechtsanwälte. Prior to that, he worked as a professor of international law and international human rights protection at the Andrássy University in Budapest, as managing director of the competence center for human rights at the University of Zurich and at the district court of Werdenberg-Sarganserland. He obtained his bachelor's and doctorate degrees at the University of St. Gallen.

In addition to his work as a lawyer, he is a lecturer at the University of Zurich and secretary of the Robert F. Kennedy Foundation for Human Rights. He is also a member of the BHRight Initiative.



Transportation from the airport

Upon your arrival, the airport will provide you with a <u>free ticket</u> to your destination. The ticket machine is located next to the exit of the luggage area!

From the airport, you can take the train in order to get to the **train station "Geneva Cornavin".** To reach the hotel from the train station, you have to take **tram 18** (**direction "Pontets"**) and stop at "**Carouge Rondeau**". The hotel is just in front of the stop.

The hotel will provide you with a <u>transportation ticket for your whole stay</u>. **Please take it with you on Thursday**, in case we take a boat to the Bains des Pâquis.
